## **Course Description**

During this class you will listen to, perform, and compose music, encouraging aesthetic and emotional development, self-discipline, and importantly, creativity. As a result, you will enhance your appreciation and enjoyment of music, an achievement that forms an ideal foundation for future study and enhances lifelong musical enjoyment. Throughout this course you will study music of all styles; each style is placed in its historical and cultural context, and you are encouraged to become perceptive, sensitive, and critical when listening. Although the majority of this course examines Western European music, the music of other cultures will be represented.

# **Assessment Objectives**

## **AO1: Listening**

- Aural awareness, perception, and discrimination in relation to Western music.
- Identifying and commenting on a range of music from cultures in different countries.
- Knowledge and understanding of one World Focus from a non-Western culture and one Western Set Work.

### **AO2: Performing**

- Technical competence on one or more instruments.
- Interpretative understanding of the music performed.

#### **AO3: Composing**

- Discrimination and imagination in free composition.
- Notation, using staff notation and, if appropriate, other suitable systems.
